- 6. Physical Therapy (DPT): 4 years
- 7. Dental School (DDS/DMD): 4 years
- 8. Occupational Therapy (OTD: 2-3 years
- 9. Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA): 2-3 years

End of June	Application data first sent to medical schools
July	Secondary applications
Mid-August	Interviews begin
September – December	Individual medical school application deadlines
Mid-October	Medical schools begin sending acceptance letters
